- A **suffix** is a syllable added to the end of a base word to change its meaning or the way it is used in a sentence.
- The suffix *-ful* means “full of _____,” as in *careful*. The suffix *-al* means “from, of, or like _____,” as in *fictional*. You can use suffixes to help you figure out the meanings of words.

Directions Read the following story about a trip to the library. Then answer the questions below.

When I went to King Memorial School, there was a contest for telling a story about our town’s original settlers. My friends and I formed a team and went to the local library. I was doubtful that our team would win until we
