Vocabulary • Context Clues

Sometimes you can use **context clues**—the words and sentences around an unknown word—to help you figure out the meaning of the word.

Directions Read the following passage. Then answer the questions below.

Heather came from a daring family. They had no fear and took many risks. Her brother Kyle was a stunt pilot, or aviator. You can see him in the cockpit of planes in a few famous movies. Her mother sailed ships. She once sailed across an ocean all by herself. She loved this solo journey because she was alone with nothing but the sound of the sea. Then

there was Heather. She enjoyed acrobatics and gymnastics. Her talents led her to the circus where she became a tightrope walker. Heather would dress up in elegant, or stylish, costumes and walk as light as a feather on the thin rope. When asked why she chose the tightrope, Heather said she was just following in her family's footsteps.

2. What context clue helps you to figure out the meaning of *aviator*?

3. What is the *cockpit* of a plane? How do you know?

4. Why would sailing *solo* in a ship be a risky decision?

5. Find the sentence with the word *elegant*. Rewrite it so you give the context clue in a different way.
