Author's Purpose

- The **author's purpose** is his or her reason for writing.
- Authors often have more than one purpose for writing. Four common reasons are: to **persuade**, **inform**, **entertain** or **express** a mood or feeling.

Directions Read the paragraph below. Then answer the questions.

One evening the crew noticed phosphorescent spots beneath the ocean surface. Often, different types of plankton would glow this way, but the spots seemed to cover one huge animal. In the morning, they saw the creature—a 60-foot whale shark! The whale shark is the largest fish in the ocean, and its jaws can grow up to four feet wide. Although the shark swam around the Kon-Tiki raft for several hours, it never attacked the raft or the crew.

Smaller sharks, however, made the water dangerous for swimming. While one sailor checked the bottom of the raft, a shark headed straight toward him! The men on board harpooned the shark to save the sailor from a nasty bite. By the end of the trip, the crew knew sharks so well that they could catch them by their tails!
