# Character and Setting • Story Structure

- A **character** is a person or animal who takes part in the events of a story. You can learn about characters by their words and actions.
- The **setting** is when and where a story takes place.
- Use the **story structure**—beginning, middle, and end—to learn about **characters** and **setting**.

**E**bu’s family owns a salt mine in North Africa. Ebu is only 10 years old. He reads about faraway cities and sees them on TV, but there is no other place he would rather live.
