Commands and Exclamations

A sentence that tells someone to do something is a **command**. A sentence that shows strong feelings is an **exclamation**.

Command Pay for your lunch.

Exclamation What a big sandwich that is!

Some commands begin with *please*. Commands usually end with periods.

The subject of a command is *you*. The word *you* is not written or said, but it is understood. Exclamations can express feelings such as surprise, anger, or excitement. Exclamations begin with a capital letter and end with an exclamation mark.
