# Capital Letters

Use **capital letters** for proper nouns. Proper nouns include days of the week, months of the year, and holidays. Titles for people should be capitalized when they are used with a person's name. Do not capitalize titles when they are used by themselves.

- Incorrect** Last october aunt Rosie and my Uncle gave a party for halloween.  
**Correct** Last October Aunt Rosie and my uncle gave a party for Halloween.  
**Incorrect** Does mother's day come earlier than memorial day?  
**Correct** Does Mother's Day come earlier than Memorial Day?
