

# Answer the 5 Ws and How

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A good news story answers the questions *who*, *what*, *where*, *when*, and *why* about an event. It might also answer the question *how* about the event.

Mr. Martin went indoors and called the fire department. However, the bear—and the food—were gone before help arrived.

1. *Who* was involved in the event?

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2. *Where* did the event happen?

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3. *Why* was the bear able to steal the food?
