When you **write about a picture**, you describe the picture's details. You may explain why you think the picture is especially interesting, beautiful, or creative.

A Big World

Topic sentence gets readers' interest and describes picture.

Huge creatures with antennae and six legs march through a dark forest covered with rocks and gravel. But wait!

Next sentences use vivid descriptive words to elaborate on picture's traits.

The huge creatures are really tiny ants. The forest is really blades of grass. The rocks and gravel are tiny grains of sand and dirt. This is a picture in *Two Bad Ants*, and it shows how big the world must look to ants. The picture shows a line of black ants marching along a white path. The ants are drawn in correct proportion to the grass. Yet people never see the ground and the grass from the ants' point of view.

Conclusion sums up why the picture is interesting.

This picture gives people a whole new view of the world.
