## A True-to-Life Story

First two sentences state writer's opinions of story.

***Me and Uncle Romie*** is a story that will make you both happy and sad. You will enjoy reading about the main character, James.

Writer supports opinions with reasons. Transitions show order of reasons.

**First of all**, James goes to New York City for the first time. It is fun to read about the city's sights and James's responses to them.

**Second**, the story's characters seem real.

James is happy sometimes. Other times he is unsure of himself, sad, or homesick. **Finally**,

James has interesting relationships with his aunt and uncle. At the story's beginning, he

does not know these family members. **By the**

**end**, he knows both them and himself much better. This story will remind readers of their own unique family members. For an enjoyable

experience, read ***Me and Uncle Romie***.

Writer ends with most important reason and tells readers to take action.
