



**Snapshot Response to

1. “Fly, Eagle, Fly!” has a lesson to teach. What do you think the lesson is?

Possible responses: You can never change who you are, so you should be yourself. Or: Nature wins out in the end.

2. Make a map showing what happened at the beginning, the middle, and the end of this Selection Snapshot.

Maps should show what happened at each point in the story. At the beginning, the man found the eagle chick and raised it as a chicken. In the middle, his friend tried to show him the bird was really an eagle. At the end, the bird soared away as an eagle.

3. What are two or three things you can tell about the farmer’s friend? Describe him.

Possible response: The farmer’s friend was determined. He was clever. He was also smart, because he understood what he needed to do to have the eagle follow its instincts.
