



**Snapshot Response to  
“Good-Bye, 382 Shin Dang Dong”  
by Frances Park and Ginger Park**

1. Make a time line showing the sequence of events during Jangmi’s first day in her new home.

Time lines should include: movers arriving, Jangmi putting away her possessions, neighbors bringing food, a girl named Mary bringing honeydew melon, neighbors leaving, Jangmi sitting under the maple tree in her new backyard.

2. If you moved to another country, what would you miss most? What would you take with you? How would your move be like Jangmi’s move?

Model: If I moved to another country, I would miss familiar faces and the places I’m used to. I would take my favorite things with me. I would hope to meet new neighbors when I arrived in the new place, and I hope I could begin to settle into my new home the way Jangmi seemed to settle into hers.
